The dates are June 20-27, 2021 and we are looking for churches to help with lunches and other needs for the teams of teens and adults. Following is a list of suggestions to help you in this important responsibility:

1. Lunch will need to be taken to the site and be ready to be served by 11:30 a.m.
2. If you have youth that can go along with you, it would be a good opportunity for them to be involved.
3. You will need to include the homeowner and whoever is present or resides at the site in lunch.
4. You will need to take a large trash bag and gather the trash to take with you - each day. Do not leave it at the site.
5. You will need to take plates, napkins, cups, drinks, and whatever else is needed. Also, providing moist towels would be nice or water and soap for cleanup.
6. You will need to take ice for lunch and an extra bag for them to put in their ice chest for the afternoon. Ice will not be needed for Wednesday afternoon.
7. It would be nice to include something for snacks in the afternoon (fruit, raisins, chips, drinks, etc.)
8. Include at least two sandwiches per person if you are making sandwiches.

Menu suggestions are available as needed. You may be as creative as you wish but remember that time will be limited, and the youth will need to work after lunch. They do not need a heavy meal that would make them sleepy.

WMU Mission Project for YOU and YOUR CHURCH!

Ministry to Standing Rock Indian Reservation



Since 2004, MANY from the Roanoke Valley have traveled to North and South Dakota to participate in mission trips to the **Standing Rock Sioux Indian Reservation**. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are **unable to proceed with the traditional mission trip to Standing Rock again this year**. However, **WMU of Virginia is taking a smaller team of about 20** who will travel to each community and provide **hygiene, school supply, preschool, and family kits** using a drive-through format. Some team members will also make one-on-one safe distanced visits with community members. **WMUV is asking supporters of the Standing Rock Ministry to donate and assemble kits for them to deliver in late July.**

Lots of kits for this ministry are needed and churches across Virginia are being asked to participate. The flyer on the next page gives a description of what is included in each kit. School supply kits (2000), preschool kits (500), hygiene kits (2000), and family activity kits (2000) will be taken.

Helpful suggestions for preparing the kits:

- 1) **VERY IMPORTANT!** Let Cathy Banton of WMUV (Phone: 804.839.6689 or cbanton@wmuv.org) know **how many kits your group will be donating**.
- 2) **Complete Kits are needed. Please do not buy individual items**, but assemble the entire kit.
- 3) Perhaps your church or WMU would consider **purchasing the bookbags, tote bags, or gallon baggies and offering these to your church family to fill**. Add the list of supplies that can be found on the next page and you have a meaningful mission activity for your church!
Please remember:
 - a. All book bags and contents need to be **gender neutral**.
 - b. Provide **ONLY the items requested**.
 - c. Purchase, as closely as possible, the **sizes requested** for the kits.
- 4) **From June 1 – June 15, Melrose, Lynn Haven and Mill Creek will serve as Drop-Off Locations** for those who do not wish to deliver kits to Richmond. Also, Mill Creek has volunteered to transport the kits from our area churches to the WMUV office in Richmond.

It is springtime, which means there are signs of life all around! Our fruit trees are blooming and bees are buzzing. The laughter of children can be heard on our playground. Friendly conversations are being had with our neighbors as they come to Food Pantry.

But most importantly, God's Word is being taught and our families are being prayed for. Proverbs 12:25 says that a good word makes the anxious man glad. Here at Friendship House, we aim to bring the best word of all—the gospel of Jesus Christ!

See below for some spring updates and needs.

- We're one year into our Food Pantry operating at elevated numbers due to Covid. So far in 2021, we are still providing canned goods, fresh food, and hygiene items to an average of 140 households each week. This is only possible due to the generosity of families, Sunday School classes, and churches who walk alongside us to share the burden. Thank you for your faithfulness!
- We've enrolled a couple extra families into After-School Program, which is very exciting for us. We still provide our weekly running club, "life skills" workshops, and bags of groceries for our kids and their families. But most importantly, each and every day they are taught from God's Word. This spring, we've been walking through the book of Luke with them.
- In 2021 we've been able to assist 5 refugee families with housing, clothing, food, furniture, and English language tutoring. This is a lot more than normal! We've been fortunate to have some local churches and families with a spare house to give these families a temporary place to stay as they come into the country.

-After school is open Mon to Thurs (closed on Fri) 1:30 to 4 we have 14 on roll and will be back to 16 to 18 max in the fall. Schedule will be determined on school times. We need volunteers to sign up now to help with homework, snack preparation and Bible study

- Little Lambs ends May 4 for this session and start back Sept 7- volunteers needed to help on Tuesday's 9 am to 12. Max 6, 3-5-year-old

- Adult Bible Study will resume open to all the regulars (15 on roll) in May. They meet on Thursday's 9:45 to 11:30. We need groups or individuals to provide lunch beginning May 20th. Lunch will be served at 11. We also need a bible study teacher beginning May 27-Sep 9. Lessons can be a Sunday school lesson or whatever you want, 45 minutes.

-Summer Camp- Starts June 14. If your church is doing VBS virtual or in person and can provide transportation we would love to come. We already are booked June 14-18 (Bonsack –virtual) June 28-July 2 (Melrose & First Baptist both virtual) July 5 – 9 (Gayton Baptist Mission Team)

We will be sending as many children as we can to overnight camp to Camp Eagle.

All other weeks are open for groups to come to us or let us come to you.

-Backpack- School supplies and children's clothes will be collected June to July and given out Sat, Aug 14. Deadline to bring us supplies is Aug 2.
