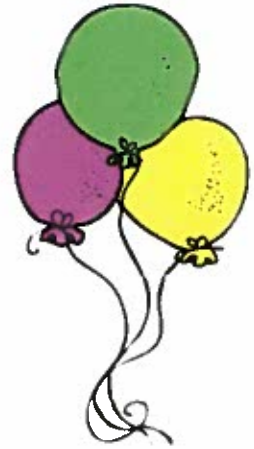

**Step 2: Make a trifold board display with pictures and information . Try to include population, literacy rate, current IMB missionaries and prayer requests.**

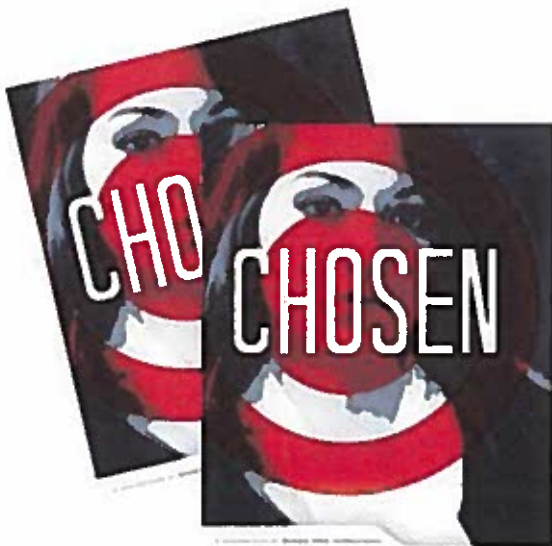
**Step 3: Prepare food that is served in that country to share with the other participants. (plan for 50)**

**Step 4: Bring your group, display board, table items and food to set up between 10:00-10:20 am.**



- Keep it simple, neat and organized.
- Use your imagination and make it attractive. Use pictures, 3-D objects, colors, graphs, charts or illustrations to draw in your audience.
- Bring food and needed spoons, napkins, etc.

As a follow-up to the Fall WMU program on Sex Trafficking, groups may contact [jeri@straightstreet.org](mailto:jeri@straightstreet.org) or [Kathleen@straightstreet.org](mailto:Kathleen@straightstreet.org) to show the Video “Chosen” to your Teens. It is also suggested that Parents be invited to attend. This is a 22 minute video telling the story of two young ladies who faced real-life encounters with trafficking and includes practical resources to spread awareness and take action. Follow-up questions and discussion will be included. Please allow at least 45 minutes for the program. As traffickers target younger and younger victims, American youth are engaged in a battle they never prepared for. Chosen is part of Shared Hope International’s campaign to increase awareness and prevention. Kathleen Chester and Jeri Harris both work for Straight Street (a local ministry to teens), which is also involved in making others aware of this serious issue.



Check out the trailer on You Tube. Look for: ***Chosen Shared Hope International.***

*Chosen*, a sex trafficking prevention video and resource package for youth tells the shocking true story of two ‘All-American’ teenage girls tricked into trafficking. Eighteen-year-old Brianna was an honor-roll student, cheerleader and worked at a local café. Thirteen-year-old Lacy was an active member of her youth group, and a volunteer in her community. Both were manipulated. Both were exploited. Both were chosen.
