

2024 SWVA RVBA WMU Mission Trip Report, Nickelsville, VA

Our annual SWVA RVBA WMU Mission Trip to Nickelsville, VA took place the week of March 3-7, 2024.

We had 46 people from 13 different churches participate this year. Jan and Tony Johnson welcomed many of us to stay at the Manor. Others stayed at motels, B&Bs or with friends.

Our **BookNet** Teams visited 1800 students in Grades Pre-k through Grade 7.

More than 6,000 books were given at 10 schools in **Lee County** (Rose Hill, St Charles, Flatwoods, Dryden), **Scott County** (Yuma, Hilton, Dungannon), and **Russell County** (Copper Creek, Swords Creek, Ft Blackmore).

Boxes of books were dropped off at 4 additional schools (Elydale, Shoemaker, Duffield, Nickelsville) and also extra books were given to St Charles.

Prior to our trip about 15 volunteers from a dozen local churches worked to sort out and process books during January and February. These books were stored at Mill Creek Baptist.

A dozen rugs/crocheted cloths were given to school personnel as a thank you for helping us when we visited them.

<u>Ditty bags</u> with shampoo, comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, and washcloth were given to over 1500 students. Deodorant was included in Grades 5-7.

<u>Two Construction Teams</u> – One team replaced the living room and hallway flooring for Miss Mary who uses a wheelchair. The other team made a bathroom shower handicapped accessible for a couple in need. Each team presented their homeowner with a prayer blanket when the job was completed.

Several volunteers went to the **Gate City <u>Food Pantry</u>** where the work included sorting donations, packing bags of food, stocking shelves, and visits/prayers with the clients.

Our **Kitchen Team** prepared and served delicious meals to the volunteers.

Everyone had an opportunity to help in the preparation of filling the ditty bags for the different schools.

As Team Leader, I would like to thank all the leaders and volunteers who served on the mission team for your hard work. A special thank you to all the churches and individuals who helped by providing the books, toiletry items, and monetary donations to help buy the supplies needed for the ditty bags and materials for the construction sites. Many prayers for this ministry were lifted up as we worked throughout the week, and we were blessed!

Just a reminder that the collection of books is ongoing all year. If you would like to donate new or gently used books, they will be accepted at Mill Creek, Melrose, or Vinton Baptist throughout the year.

Since we need over 1600 ditty bags each year, these can be made throughout the year and taken to the same drop off churches or give me a call and I will be happy to pick them up from your church.

Again, without your faithful support, this special ministry would not be possible. May the Lord continue to bless you and your church throughout the coming year as you serve others in your community.

The first Baptist Mission Center of the Roanoke Valley Baptist Association was opened in 1939 and began operation on Salem Avenue and *Miss Annie Mae Broyles* was its first Missionary Director.

With summer just around the corner, we are thankful for God's provision. Through the faithfulness & generosity of brothers and sisters in the faith throughout the Roanoke Valley, we have been able to keep our doors open these past 4 ½ years since becoming a non-profit. That's a huge sign of grace!

... Signs of Grace

- Our Spring English Club (ESL) is finishing up the semester on April 24! We've had close to 70 students from around the world attend our women's class with an additional 25 students in our co-ed classes! We're in the process of scheduling our summer session.
- Just a few weeks ago we were able to release a first-in-the-nation web platform called Link2Hope Roanoke. Through Link2Hope we aim to provide an opportunity for churches to connect with those in the Roanoke community who are in need and isolated from the church. - Our Talitha Koum After-School Program just welcomed a new child from another nation. It is such a blessing to be able to minister to kids from all walks of life—American kids, as well as kids from Afghanistan, Ivory Coast, South Africa, Brazil and Haiti. When we gather for Bible lesson and singing during the program, we are given a sweet reminder that there will be a day when ALL nations will one day be worshiping our Lord together.
- This spring we're holding Faith & Finances classes for our families who struggle financially. This ministry empowers our marginalized neighbors with financial literacy & training in Biblical stewardship.
- This semester we have been blessed with 7 interns from around the country! They have been a huge help to us and we've enjoyed pouring into them. Spring, the first season of the year. God has given the earth a fresh start to new life just as accepting Jesus will give a person a new start. Spring is my favorite time of year and if you know me you know why. Yes, it is the start of garden season. God's blessings have been many this past year and I pray that each church will be blessed with a revival of new people and the need to have Jesus in their lives. Just like a garden, churches need to till the earth and reap the harvest of new lives. Keystone has been blessed with some new volunteers and continues to be a building block in many family lives here in this part of SE. If you are new to the area or a church belonging to the RVBA I am inviting you to Keystone Community Center to see how you can serve in a ministry, thriving and growing, that has been in the Roanoke Valley since 1939. We are currently looking to hire a director in training, summer camp leader, and preschool lead teacher.

- --Adult Bible Study has an average of 5 attending every Thursday with a hot meal served. We give out a bag of groceries the last Thursday of each month with 40 bags being distributed.
- --Special seasonal food boxes, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter fed 150 families.
- --Little Lamb Learners had 3 for the year and were very active in learning beginner Bible stories and the basic skills needed to start school. We had a summer session this past summer with 4 participating to prepare first time students for school.
- --After school had 13 students in the last school year and 11 for the current year. Numbers are down on purpose due to lack of volunteers. The children learn so much about the Bible, the life of Christ and His followers and life skills they can use forever, and they get a nice meal before they go home.
- --Summer camp 2023 had 22 children signed up but numbers varied every day. We attended 4 VBS's that offered transportation, Vinton Baptist, Melrose Baptist, Bonsack Baptist, and Troutville Baptist. We had a new program introduced for children, "Garden to Table" with 10 children who signed up. These children attended 2 to 3 meetings a week working in Keystone's 900 square foot training garden, making a monthly menu, going to a grocery store to get prices to see how much money they save by growing their own, learning about the health benefits, canning, Biblical references and much more. We plan on expanding it next summer.
- --Backpack program will be offered again in 2024. School items will be collected in June and July. Call for a list.
- --Backyard Gardens helped feed 86 people plus what some of the gardeners gave away. We have 7 households signed up for 2024 so far. We hope to exceed the 3,000 pounds of food grown last year and start the mini market inside KCC gates in July.
- --Food preservation for 2024 has grown to 5 families to can and freeze produce grown in their gardens. In 2023 over 400 jars of food were canned and over 30 gallons frozen.
- --NEW!! You can be a part of a Biblical playground, the only one like it in Virginia. Pray for all stations to be sponsored by churches and groups. Please call to get the schematics and timeline. We will need carpenters, artists, and more. Closing on the property is May 6, 2024.
