2025 SWVA Partnership Mission Report

The 2025 SWVA Mission Team led by the WMU of the Association worked during the week of March $9 - 13^{th}$ in the southwestern part of our state. There were 47 volunteers from a dozen of our local churches who participated in the ministries that took place throughout the week.

The BookNet Teams visited 9 schools in Scott and Lee Counties and were able to give over 6000 books to students in levels Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 7. They gave about 1500 cloth ditty bags filled with health supplies to the students they encountered. In addition to this, they dropped off books to 5 different schools for distribution to students that they were unable to visit.

In addition to the ministry to students, the Construction Team completed much needed improvements to a home. They built a handicapped ramp for a woman confined to a wheelchair and replaced the kitchen and bathroom floors in her home. They also removed her tub and installed a walk-in shower. The Food Pantry Team worked at the pantry in Gate City and were able to bag groceries and meet clients as they came to receive food. Behind the scenes work was done by the Prep Team that worked at the Nickelsville Baptist Church Family Life Center to fill all the ditty bags that were given to students.

All of these teams were well supported by the Cooking Team that provided delicious meals throughout the week. No one went hungry!

A team of 47 were the ones with "boots on the ground" that week in Southwest Virginia, but hundreds more were a part of the team.

MANY, MANY from our churches and community donated the children's books that were given away. Countless hours were spent by volunteers sorting, labeling, counting and boxing books in preparation for the trip.

Seamstresses throughout the valley used their sewing skills to create beautiful handmade bags. Churches and individuals generously supplied the funds to purchase the toiletries.

Prayers were offered by many for the safety and witness of the team. This has been a wonderful ministry to our neighbors in southwest Virginia for over 20 years and many have been blessed. To God be the glory for the great things he has done!

Spring, the first season of the year. God has given the earth a fresh start to new life just as accepting Jesus will give a person a new start. Spring is my favorite time of year and if you know me you know why. Yes, it is the start of garden season. God's blessings have been many this past year and I pray that each church will be blessed with a revival of new people and the need to have Jesus in their lives. Just like a garden, churches need to till the earth and reap the harvest of new lives. Keystone has been blessed with some new volunteers and continues to be a building block in many family lives here in this part of SE. If you are new to the area or a church belonging to the RVBA, I am inviting you to Keystone Community Center to see how you can serve in a ministry, thriving and growing, that has been in the Roanoke Valley since 1939. We are currently looking to hire a mature Christian, director in training, summer camp leader, and preschool lead teacher.

--Adult Bible Study has been shrinking as many of our participants have passed away this past year. We have 3 to 4 attending every Thursday with a hot meal served and delivering 2 homebound meals weekly. We give out a bag of groceries the last Thursday of each month with 40 bags being distributed. Thanks to the AOM group at First Roanoke for bringing lunch on the 1st Thursday each month and different groups other Thursdays. We will not have ABS during the summer.

--Special seasonal food boxes, Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter fed 160 families impacting 200 people.

-- Little Lamb Learners had 3 for the year and were very active in learning beginner Bible stories and the basic skills needed to start school. Due to not having a lead teacher for summer session pre-k was not held (hope 2025 we will).

-- After school had 13 students in the last school year and 11 for the current year. Numbers are down on purpose due to lack of volunteers. The children learn so much about the Bible, the life of Christ and His followers and life skills they can use forever, and they get a nice meal before they go home.

-- Summer camp 2024 had 28 children signed up but numbers varied every day. We attended 4 VBS's that offered transportation, Bonsack Baptist, First Roanoke, Clearbrook Baptist and Vinton Baptist, Child Evangelism came to us for a week, and we had our Read, Write & Sign Language camp with 15 children. We sent 5 children to WMU Children's camp. A new program introduced for children, "Garden to Table" with 10 children signed up. These children attended 2 to 3 meetings a week working in Keystone's 900 square foot training garden, making a monthly menu, going to a grocery store to get prices to see how much money they save by growing their own, learning about the health benefits, canning, biblical references and held a first time, vegetable market on site selling \$450 of veggies in 2 hours. We plan on expanding to 2 times a month this year 2025. We had 3 professions of faith and 1 baptism.

--Backpack program will be offered again in 2025. School items will be collected in June and July. Call for a list or check our website; keystonecommunitycenter.org. This year Aug 14th at 6pm everyone invited to Gather around the Flagpole to pray for our schools and children.

-- Backyard Gardens helped feed 86 people plus what some of the gardeners gave away and what was used in KCC programs. We have 10 households signed up for 2025. We hope to exceed the 3,000 pounds of food grown last year and start the mini market inside KCC gates in June

-- Food preservation for 2025 has grown to 6 families to can and freeze produce grown in their gardens. In 2024 over 400 jars of food were canned and over 30 gallons frozen.

-- NEW!! You can be a part of our Child/Adult Bible playground, the only one like it in Virginia. Pray for all stations to be sponsored by churches and groups. Please call to get the schematics and timeline. We will need carpenters, artists, and more. Work has been slow due to the weather and workers catching up on jobs delayed by weather, but we hope to be open this summer.

Spring has sprung! As we consider the prior year, while looking at 2025 and beyond, we are thankful for God's provision. We are also grateful for the faithfulness & generosity of the local church throughout the Roanoke Valley. These past 5+ years as a non-profit have shown us plenty signs of grace!

- Our Good Neighbor Refugee Program provides safe & secure housing for families fleeing war, violence or persecution. This spring we have 2 English Clubs in operation, and are supporting one of our partner churches who recently started a co-ed class. Through this ministry and our church partnerships, we are able to serve close to 100 men & women from around the world!
- One year ago we released the first-in-the-nation web platform called Link2Hope Roanoke. Through Link2Hope we provide an opportunity for churches to connect with those in the Roanoke community who are in need and isolated from the church. You can check it out at www.link2hoperoanoke.org
- Our Talitha Koum After-School Program has around 20 children that regularly attend each day. It is such a blessing to be able to minister to kids from all walks of life—American kids, as well as kids from Afghanistan, Ivory Coast, South Africa, Brazil and Haiti. This year our Ministry Assistants have been teaching the kids from the Gospel of Mark. Many of these children are unchurched, so this is their first exposure to Jesus.
- This spring we're holding Jobs for Life classes for our families who struggle with unemployment or underemployment. This ministry empowers our marginalized neighbors with job readiness & training in Biblical stewardship.
- This semester we have been blessed with 4 Liberty University interns from around the country! They have been a huge help to us and we've enjoyed pouring into them. We are accepting applications for summer & fall internships. For more info, check out our website.
